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What is the Geriatric Adult Mental Health Specialty Team Program (GAST)

Purpose

To increase the ability of people working in community agencies/organizations in providing services and support to older adults with mental health and substance use issues.

Activities

- Provide training on topics such as signs & symptoms of depression, anxiety, and dementia; crisis prevention; substance use/misuse.
- Provide consultation to the people receiving training to enhance topic taught
- Serve as Coaches for community agencies/organizations implementing Healthy IDEAS.

GAST Training Topics

- Typical symptoms and behaviors associated with mental illness and/or substance use disorders among older adults
- Mood Disorders (depression, bipolar disorder)
- Anxiety disorders (PTSD, OCD, panic disorder)
- Schizophrenia and other Psychotic Disorders (paranoid, delusional, and psychotic disorders)
- Substance use disorders and Issues (alcohol use, prescription medication misuse, illicit drugs use)
- Cognitive Disorders (delirium, dementia to include Alzheimer's disease).
- Personality Disorders
- Typical medications used & associated side effects



GAST Training Topics

- Effective communication verbal and non-verbal
- Crisis prevention and de-escalation techniques
- Accessing crisis services through the LME/MCO
- Suicide indicators, response, and prevention
- Communicating mental health and/or substance use observations and interaction with psychiatrist, physician, and nurses
- Techniques to assess behaviors that may be the result of medical conditions or environmental factors
- Understanding the LME/MCO system and how to make referrals for mental health and/or substance use treatment and services.



GAST Program

- GAST is available in all 100 Counties.
- Teams are composed of Registered Nurses and QMHP with a Master Degree in a human service.
- Other staff may include Registered Nurses, Advanced Practice Nurses and Master or Bachelor QMHP with degree in a human service field.
- All Team Members have experience working with older adults with mental health and substance use disorders and training experience



GAST Community Interaction

- Partners Behavioral Health Management GAST has become very active in the community
- Our GAST is involved with the Council on Aging, Meals on Wheels, Senior Centers, Adult Day Programs, Continuing Care Retirement Communities, Law Enforcement, Community Watch Groups, Faith Based Organizations, NC Community Care Block Grant Advisory Committee, Adult Protective Services, Adult and Aging Services, DSS
- Also a part of the NC Institute of Medicine task force for older adults at the state level
- The NC GAST also helped write a portion of training for the NC Justice Academy on Elder Abuse
