METHODS

- Qualtrics Survey
 - Sent to 48 individuals
 - Reminder sent
 - 24/48 individuals responded (50% response rate)

- What motivated you to join the Task Force?
 - 75% Professional interest
 - 75% Organization has vested interest
 - 42% Personal interest
 - 4% Other
- How many meetings have you attended (either in person or by phone)?
 - Mean: 3.8 meetings (range 0-5)

- Are there individuals/organizations that aren't represented on the Task Force who should be?
 - 43% Yes
 - Juvenile Justice
 - LME/MCO
 - Elizabeth Hudgins CFTF, Rob Thompson NC Child
 - Media producers and outlets
 - Law Enforcement
 - DPI
 - Churches
 - Higher education

- Overall, how satisfied are you with how the Task Force is going?
 - Mean: 4.05 (range 3-5)
- How satisfied are you with how the steering committee communicates to the Task Force?
 - Mean: 4.0 (range 2-5)

- Have you had sufficient opportunity to be involved in the decision making process?
 - 90% Yes
- Have you felt welcomed and included?
 - 95% Yes

- What has worked well for you?
 - Presentations
 - Small groups
 - Diverse group
 - Meeting times and location
- What could be improved?
 - Clearer process and outcome plan
 - Subgroups that could meet separately
 - More time to brainstorm

- What is your understanding of the purpose of the Task Force?
 - Develop a state plan to support SSNREs/reduce child maltreatment
- What is your understanding of the collective impact process?
 - Working together, aligning around common goals
