# Proposed Evaluation Criteria

1. Importance: evidence-based, focused on areas in which there is significant variation in or less than optimal performance, and will make significant gains in health care quality (burden of suffering: morbidity/mortality/cost)
2. Usability: measure results can be used for accountability and performance improvement to achieve higher quality care
3. Feasibility: measure specifications require data that are readily available or could be captured without undue burden
4. Harmonization: aligned with measures for other settings and populations, and for other insurers/payers

# Additional Considerations

- Measure set will address all domains of the Quadruple Aim (lower costs, improve health outcomes, improve patient experience, improve clinician experience). To include:
  - Overall cost and key cost drivers
  - Safety and quality
  - Patient experience and consumer engagement
  - Provider engagement, joy in practice, and job satisfaction for healthcare workforce, with an eye to workforce development
  - Health outcomes/population health
- Methodological considerations for risk adjustment as appropriate, to include social determinants of health and attribution considerations.
