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Task Force Meeting 5 Recap:

Last meeting, we heard from Cherie Ashe about her experiences receiving Medicaid during her pregnancy. We also heard from Dr. Kim Newton, Medical Director of Alamance County Health Department, about the prenatal services her department provides and from Dr. Alison Steube, an Associate Professor at UNC Gillings School of Public Health, on her research surrounding the Fourth Trimester. The meeting ended with a thorough review of working recommendations from the task force.

Looking Forward -- Task Force Meeting 7: (6/6/19)

At this meeting we hope to get into access to care for high risk pregnancies (seeing specialists and Medicaid acceptance), including speaking with Health Department Maternity Health Coordinators on their role in referrals and follow-up to these specialist appointments. This meeting will also focus on Behavioral Health and Substance use, from prenatal to post-partum care.
