Task Force Meeting 8 Recap: At our last meeting, we learned about innovative roles and systems developed to support women in the perinatal period. Specifically, we were given an overview of centering programs tailored to pregnancy and the benefits of such programs, information on the importance and role of childbirth education, and overviews of the role of doulas and community health workers in the perinatal context. After lunch, we heard from a panel of PHP representatives and a representative director from a state local health department. This panel discussed Medicaid transformation, and the plans that each PHP is formulating to improve maternal health in North Carolina. The LHD representative spoke to the ways in which the PHPs and LHDs will work in concert moving forward.

Looking Forward – Task Force Meeting 10 (8/29/2019):

At our August 29th meeting, we hope to focus on implicit bias in the perinatal sphere, and ways to allow mothers and families to take a greater role in healthcare. Specifically, we will explore how implicit bias affects care delivery and health outcomes, and discuss the benefits of Parent-Family Advisory Councils and social media support groups as a means of empowering patient-mothers and their families. Finally, we will continue to review and refine proposed Task Force recommendations.
