12:50 – 1:40 PRIMARY CARE PROVIDER TRAINING IN PALLIATIVE CARE

In this session, Dr. Fischer will discuss potential models and goals for training primary care providers in palliative care, including clinical-level elements such as symptom management and patient/family communication; delivery-systemlevel elements such as incorporating palliative care expertise across care settings; and how payment reforms, such as a move to value-based payment, is conducive to increasing team-based models of care.
