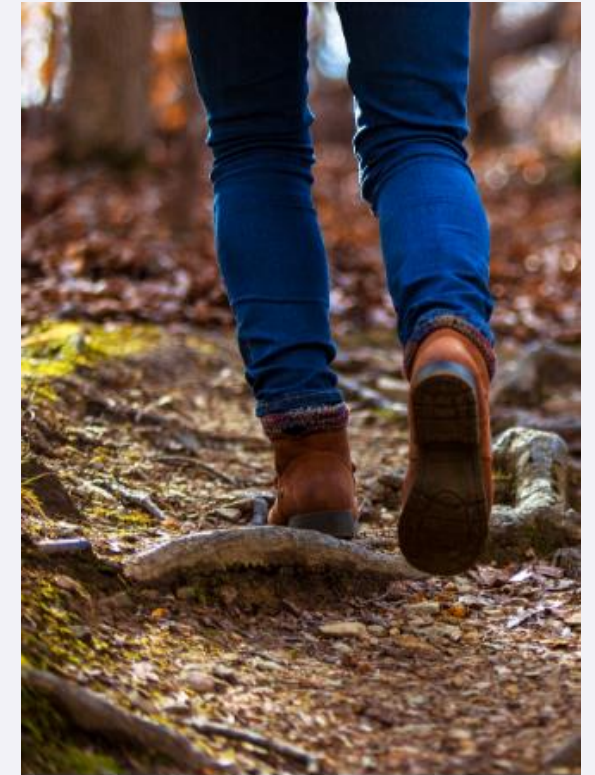
Serious Illness Care

 - Public education and engagement



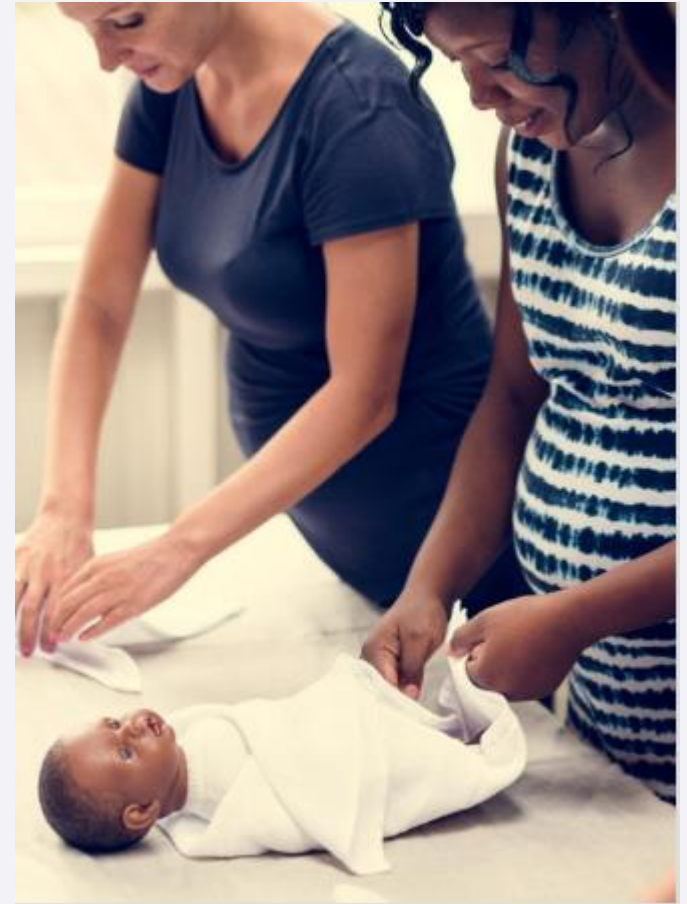
Healthy North Carolina 2030

 - Service gaps



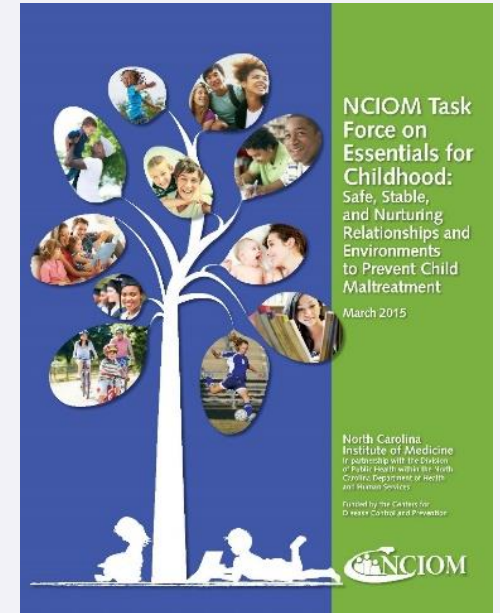
Access to Care for People that are Deaf and Hard of Hearing
