




#### What is the NCIOM?

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

### Task Force Report and Beyond

#### Task Force Recommendations and Report

- Recommendations and report are circulated to task force members several times before being finalized
- Sometimes task force members choose to prioritize recommendations
- Task force members may vote on recommendations to help determine consensus
- NCIOM Board members must review the report before it is finalized
- Final Report in late spring (May) 2022
- Reports distributed widely, other dissemination
  - Shorter 4-6 page Issue Brief
  - Update published approximately 5 years after report is published

  - Additional investment in LHDs




